6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Nine numbers of Associate Professors of the college are members of Board of Studies of the Sambalpur University. The BOS are the statutory bodies' responsible for development of curriculum for Undergraduate courses.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Every department is encouraged to use LCD projectors and White Boards for improvement of Teaching – Learning Processes. They are also encouraged to conduct seminars in the department regularly.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college follows the examination norms and rules laid by Sambalpur University, Odisha while conducting the University examinations. It also conducts test examination basing on which the students are allowed to appear in the final university examination. The college has also been selected as a central valuation zone by Sambalpur University.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The Faculty members are encouraged to apply for research projects to various funding agencies like UGC, CSIR, ICSSR.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college is planning to make extension of its existing library building where a reading room of 60 seating capacity will be established. LCD projectors have been supplied to five departments to be used for improvement of teaching and learning process. The High speed broadband network internet facility is also available and the faculty members are encouraged to use the service to refer the online study material for improvement teaching, learning and research. There is a proposal for construction of five classrooms, four laboratories and one administrative blocks.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Faculty members of the college are assigned responsibilities to organise and manage various activities of the college like accounts, administration, sports and games, library, college magazine, drama and debates, NSS, NCC, students grievance etc.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

It is the responsibility of the state government to appoint both teaching and non-teaching staff through Public Service Commission and SSB as it is a government college. However, the college makes temporary appointments to some of the post like guest faculty for teaching and contractual temporary appointment for non-teaching like attendants, Gardner, watchman etc from its own development funds.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

There is no collaboration with any industrial body.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Admissions into all undergraduate courses are carried out under e-admission through Student Admission Management System (SAMS). Admission into post graduate studies are done on the basis of aggregate marks in the qualifying examination. The students having honours at degree level are given first preference in their respective subjects.
