### **About the Survey**


Students of the institution comprise the majority of its stakeholders, and all of its initiatives are directed toward fostering an environment that is conducive to academic success and free of obstacles. In this sense, the institution has offered a plethora of resources to help students succeed. The institution works to accomplish the goals of its programs during this process. The institution is further emphasizing that it is accomplishing its objectives, and as a result, it is vital to get the views and opinions of students, who are the foremost stakeholders, and find any deviations from the norm to improve the system. For this reason, the survey is being conducted.

#### **Survey Process**


With the assistance of the heads of every department, the Internal Quality Assessment Cell (IQAC) conducts and reports the survey. After being prepared, the questionnaires were distributed to all departments before being given to the students. The survey's transactional, teaching-learning, and evaluation components will aid in raising the standard of higher education. Logical conclusions are reached after compiling and analyzing the replies collected on these aspects into a spreadsheet. The weighted average value of student satisfaction is determined after giving the criteria weights based on the members of the IQAC's opinion. The finding of the survey will assist the institution in identifying student's immediate and long-term needs and in putting corrective measures in place.

Total number of 703 students had answered 15 different questions regarding teaching learning process and quality of education.


Following are the feedback from students and the parameters adopted for the survey are follows:




Approximately, 66.6% of all students strongly agreed that 85 to 100 % of the syllabus was covered. For 24.2 % of students reported completion of the syllabus between 70 to 80 %. According to the feedback, 7.1% and 1.8 % of students completion of syllabus 55 to 69 % and 30 to 54 %, respectively. Whereas a negligible percentage of students reported completion of syllabus is less than 30 %.




Almost 54.5% of students agreed that the teachers were prepared for the class thoroughly. 38.1% of students found the preparation of teachers was satisfactory. However a small percentage of students those were 3.8 and 2.6 % of students responded for poor preparation and indifferent teacher's preparation for the class. A negligible percentage of students chose "Won't teach at all" option during the collection of feedback.




In response to the most crucial question regarding the communication of teachers, 75.1% found it always effective, while 15.1 % chose sometimes effective. 7.4% and 1.4 % found the communication of teachers Just satisfactory and Generally inactive, respectively. This is sensible as a majority of students found communication always effective.




To answer the question 48.1 % of the students described the teacher's approach to teaching as excellent, about 30.3% found the teacher very good at teaching and about 17.4 % found it good. Whereas 4% found it fairly good and a small amount 0.3 % responded it was poor.




In response to the Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers 72.3 % found it always fair, 21.5 % reacted as usually fair, and 5.1% considered it sometimes unfair.




Nearly 52.5% of students consider the teacher's internal assessment process to be done fairly all the time, and 25.6% think it is done usually, while 14.7 % view it as done sometimes and the rest of the students feel it is executed rarely or never.




In response to a feedback question regarding the university's active interest in encouraging internships, student exchanges, and field visits, 50% of students stated that it is a regular practice, 16.9 % said that it occurs frequently, and 17.8% indicated that it occasionally occurs for them.




In response to the question, 39.5 % of students say that the institution's mentoring program and course syllabus significantly support students' significantly for cognitive, social, and emotional growth, compared to 25.5% who think the university is very well promoting it, 14.9 % who agree that it is doing it moderately a rest of the person opted for marginally or for not at all.






67.7 % of students agreed that it happens every time faculties use examples and applications to explain concepts, 21.6% thought it happened frequently, and others said it happened infrequently.






In response to the question, 60.7 % of students claimed that teachers are able to recognize their deficiencies and provide them with the support they need to overcome them, 19.2 % of students said that this happened generally, 12.8 % said that this happened sometimes. The rest of the students were chosen for rarely or it happened for never.



In response to the question, 58.7 % of students strongly agreed that teachers are able to recognize their deficiencies and provide them with the support they need to overcome them, 30.7% of students agreed, 15% said that this happened neutral, and 6% said that this happened seldom.



Among all, 30 % of students indicates more than 90 % use smart tools. According to 28% of students, between 70 and 89% of teachers use ICT resources in the classroom. 15% that it is approximately 50–69%, 8.5 % that it is between 30 and 49%.



In answer to the question, 45.7% of students strongly agreed, and 39.5% students agree that the overall quality of teaching is good. However, 11.4 % of students remain neutral and rest of the students disagree with the proposition.


### **Survey Process**


